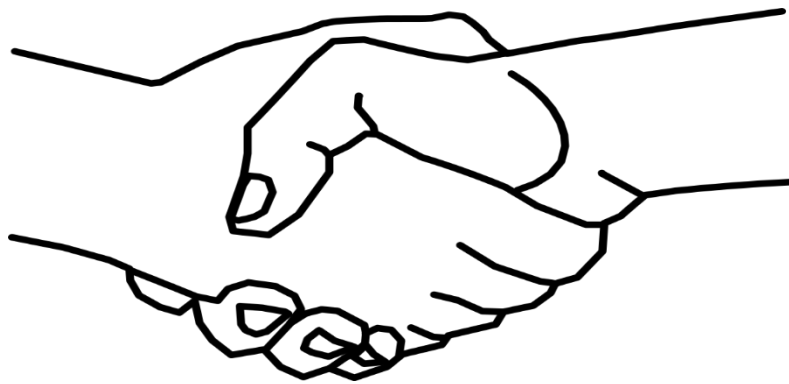

Highlighted Employer Services

Work Incentives Planning and Assistance Program (WIPA)

Helps individuals with Supplemental Security Income (SSI) and Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) understand how earned income from work affects their cash benefits and medical card and/or Medicare.

West Virginia Assistive Technology System (WVATS)

Free statewide services designed to ensure West Virginia residents have an opportunity to make informed decisions before purchasing assistive technology devices. Demonstrations, Device Loans and Trainings, and Informational and Referral services are available for individuals, families, agencies, or employers.

Benefits/Services

- **Direct Job Placement** – Provided to individuals who have vocational or work goal in mind and need assistance in both preparatory skills (resume and interview skills and assistance landing the job).
- **Job Coaching** – Provides short term job coaching for training, transition, and retention of employment.
- **Daniel Memorial Life Skills training** – Curriculum based program that teaches individuals the tools they need to succeed in life and live independently. Program focuses on 16 core areas including housekeeping, job readiness, food management, money management, legal skills, education planning and more.
- **Work Skills Assessment** – Facility based training that combines curriculum-based instruction combined with hands on work, designed to gauge an individual's ability to work in janitorial, clerical, food service, or laundry field.
- **Community Based Assessment** – Similar to Work Skills Assessment, but the work experience and training takes place in a community setting, and the placement or work experience site is open to a larger field of occupations and interests.

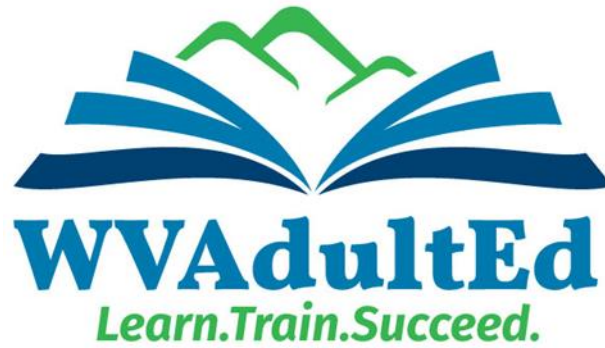

Apprenticeship programs are a written plan designed to move an apprenticeship from a low or no skill position to full occupational proficiency. The office of Apprenticeship or State Apprenticeship Agency provides technical assistance to sponsors to set up and maintain their programs and to customize apprenticeship programs to meet their needs.

Eligibility

An apprenticeship program can be sponsored by an individual business, group of businesses, employer association or intermediary. Program sponsors identify the minimum qualifications needed to apply to their apprenticeship program, e.g., education, ability to physically perform the essential functions of the occupation.

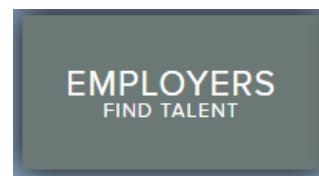
